"Service technicians shall be well trained, and capable of replacing malfunctioning equipment in the polling places. Each technician who performs troubleshooting in polling places must have reliable, dedicated transportation that will allow the technician to promptly respond to a polling place voting system problem situation, and said transportation shall be of sufficient size to accommodate several voting units. As a primary function, these technicians shall transport spare voting units for possible replacement of polling place voting units that are inoperative. Units that cannot be repaired "on the spot" and needed at the polling location for the capturing of votes shall be picked up immediately after the election ends, repaired and returned. Each technician shall further maintain a reasonable supply of spare parts and components necessary to repair a malfunctioning unit or return it to service. Technicians must also have cellular telephones or other means of real time communication so that they may be dispatched to polling locations that are experiencing system problems."
